Meet Daniel Salaton, Senior Manager - Express Cargo & E-Commerce at Kenya Airways Cargo.



With two decades at KQ under his belt, Daniel has seen the airline grow through challenges and opportunities. Today, he heads the Express and E-Commerce section, a dynamic part of the cargo business that is adapting quickly to the demands of e-commerce and next-day delivery.

"The number one question we get from customers is: Where is my cargo? With live tracking, we can empower customers so they won't have to ask us anymore. They'll have that power in their own hands."

Away from cargo, Daniel is passionate about golf in fact, he currently serves as captain of the Kenya Airways Golf team. Golf, he says, is how he unwinds after busy weeks.

Music is another source of joy: "I love gospel music, Maasai hymns, and I'm also into Urban tone. I listen to Bien a lot."
